The League, established through Claremont McKenna College, was established to facilitate debate in middle schools across California. The league hosts debate tournaments for burgeoning debaters. The tournaments provide a forum for all students, regardless of grades and classification, who are normally underserved in the current school system. Through my experience with debate over the past eight years, I have witnessed marginal students “become alive” through debate. Debate has the potential to touch every aspect of a student’s life as it provides an excellent opportunity for students to develop and master the life skills of oral communication and critical thinking.

Members of the debate team are expected to be self-motivated, ambitious, and self-sufficient. Successful debaters eat, drink, and sleep debate. Many of Frisbie’s debaters desire careers in law and politics. This is the first step. I would appreciate any support and encouragement you can give our debaters.

How can I help my debater?

- **Practice** The only way to improve as a debater is to practice. There are two five-minute speeches in a debate, concluded with one three-minute speech. Having your debater practice in front of a small audience will be helpful for their development.
- **Research** There is also a lot of research required for debating; the use of Internet sites such as: cnn.com, about.com, and google.com can be quite helpful. A trip to the local library, reading the newspaper, or watching the news and “60 Minutes” will assist as well.
- **Dinnertime Conversation** Holding conversations with your debater about current events will help your debater develop a firm understanding of the topic. Challenging, even interrupting, your debater with arguments from the opposite side will keep your debater on their toes.
